Violence Prevention in Health Care: Sharing Lessons Learned from the OAHHS Worker Safety Initiative

Session Description:

The incidence of workplace violence (WPV) in health care is increasing in the US. OSHA, the Joint Commission, the American Nurses Association and other professional entities are currently developing initiatives to address this issue.

In Oregon, 5 hospitals recently participated in a 2-year Workplace Safety Initiative (WSI) to explore how best to develop WPV prevention programs.

The WSI is a collaborative project between Oregon Association for Hospitals and Health Care Systems (OAHHS), it's member hospitals, SEIU 49 and Oregon Nurses Association (ONA)

This session will discuss:

- ▶ Current trends in health care violence and prevention strategies from a systems perspective.
- ▶ Lessons learned from the WPV WSI initiative
- ▶ A programmatic approach to addressing WPV in healthcare that incorporates best practices in violence prevention
- ▶ How to effectively use the Toolkit for Prevention and Management of WPV that was developed as a result of the WSI initiative
